

This gentleman, it need not be said, is an expert at his business, and has had the establishment in his charge fitted up with the latest and most approved machinery and appliances. Every item of material used is thoroughly tested as to its qualifications, the soap and soda analyzed, and every precaution taken that each is of the purest possible nature.

NO VISITORS HERE. The laundry itself is a square, ivy-covered building, with a wing project-ing from one side. It has no pretensions ing from one side. It has no pretensions to architectural beauty or appearance, but its interior has been designed for the special purpose for which it is fitted. In this the personal linen of Her Majesty is dealt with, and no stranger, under any circumstances, is permitted inside its walls. On either side of a stone passage are large cupboards, which are thoroughly ventilated, and stored with the various kinds of soap used. 
