The Right Honorable Sir John Alexander Macdonald, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Doctor of Civil Law, Doctor of Laws, One of Her Majesty's Council Learned in the Law and a member of Her Majesty's Privy Council for Canada, etc.

Right Honorable Sir:—On this the fortieth anniversary of your entry into public life, we, the Conservatives of Manitoba, beg to tender you our sincere congratulations as the great and wise statesman who has moulded the destinies of Canada during the last forty years.

One of the disjunct Provinces and Counties of British America under your enlightened statesmanship the Dominion of Canada has been formed and we recognize the ability and wisdom that were required to ally sectional feelings and promote the spirit of harmony that now exists among the Provinces of the Union.

We congratulate you on the success that has attended the many measures of utility and progress inaugurated and carried out by you during your long career as a public man and now that that great enterprise the Canadian Pacific Railway, which has engaged your attention so largely, is approaching completion we trust that a special Providence may not only spare your life to see its consummation, and also an outlet from this country by Hudson Bay secured, but may grant you health to witness the beneficial results to Canada of the far reaching statements that conceived and carried to a successful issue this great undertaking.

Permit us to convey through you to Lady Macdonald our feelings of respect and admiration for the many estimable qualities of heart and head which have endeared her to all with whom she has come in contact, and to express the hope that she may long be spared to lighten the arduous duties devolving upon you in the high and important sphere of life you occupy.
