It is a quiet pursuit, light, composed, reflective, and what is more, it is instructive. It conduces to an acquisition of a good deal beyond stamps only—a knowledge of geography, a knowledge of the advancement of civilization, for the first adoption of the stamp system in any country marks a great and pregnant era in its progress; a knowledge of the different kingdoms, commonwealths and republics of the world, a knowledge of the fall of dynasties, the death of rulers, and the appointment of their successors. Neither is it without interest to the student of the fine arts, as it is curious to note and compare the talent or want of it exhibited by different nations in the art of engraving, as evinced in the devices on the stamp.
