It is belebed there has been considerable insect damage to the growing Winter Wheat in Ohio, Indiana and Michigan, and some well-posted people believe the damage from frost to the French crop would advance foreign markets, as the French are always quick buyers when they want Wheat. Considering this situation, but more particularly the fact that senti-ment amongst leading local operators is very generally bearish and the market be-comes easily congested, we feel like buying upon the weak spots occurring every two or three days until we get past what we consider the present sensitive condition
