Benefits given by the I.O.F.

1.—Social and Fraternal Privileges of the Court Room.

2.—Free Tedical Attendance by Court Physician where not dispensed with by Court by-law; also trained nurses in certain cases.

3.—A Sick Benefit of \$2 to \$5, per week, subject to provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the Order; optional, and when taken costs extra.

4.—A Total and Permarent Disability Benefit of one-half of face value of policy, with exemption from further payment of premiums or Court Dues.

5.—An Old Age Benefit consisting of exemption from payment of premiums and Court dues after age 70.

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6.—An Old Age Disability Benefit of one-tenth of face value of policy payable yearly for ten years, on being declared totally and permanently disabled by infirmities of age after the seventieth birthday.

7.—An Old Age Pension payable during disability, which may be taken as a substitute for the Old Age Disability Benefit.

8.—A Burial Benefit of \$100 at death of a Pensioner.

9.—A Funeral Benefit of \$500 at death of a member enrolled in Sick and Funeral Benefit Department.

9.—A Funeral Benefit of \$50 at death or a memoer enrolled in Section Benefit Department.
10.—The Flortuary Benefit of \$500, \$1,000, \$2,000, \$3,000 \$4,000 or \$5,000.
