Thorax short, obovoid, above bare or nearly ; metathoracic spiracles (?) oval ; mandibles bidentate ; abdomen red and black, with the first segment petioliform, of an equal width throughout
Males Table of Genera. Females I. Females 7. Subapterous or with rudimentary wings. 7. Thorax ovoid, coarsely sculptured, or rugosely punctured, with a black pubescence; head rather large, quadrate, wider than the thorax; eyes small, rounded; mandibles 3-dentate; first joint of the flagellum not short, but hardly longer than the second.
