NEW METHOD OF ESTIMATING RENAL PERMEABILITY.—Simonelli (Centralblatt f. Chirurgie, No 1900) commends potassium iodide, given in gelatin capsules with a moderate quantity of water, as a means of estimating kidney permeability. Normally iodine is eliminated in both the urine and saliva within the first half-hour and continues for some time. In cases of nephritis, the iodine is not detected for from five to
twenty hours, is passed in less quantity somewhat irregularly, and its
elimination is not so long continued. Its presence is determined by the
ordinary starch paper test.—Therapeutic Gazette.
