PROLONGED URETO-GESTATION.—Dr. Park, in the Glasgow Medical Fournal, gives the history of The medical men in Orangeville and surround- a case of prolonged utero-gestation, in which the ing country met a short time ago and organized an period of gestation was 331 days. The fœtus was anencephalic, and there was only a very small quantity of liquor amnii. The writer states that the most likely explanation of this prolonged gestation seems to be, that the cephalic extremity being flat on the crown and about the size of the palm of the hand, was incapable of being moulded and so filling up and pressing equally upon the dilated neck of the womb. The small quantity of liq. am. is noticeable as bearing upon Rudolphi's theory as to the causation of the anencephalic monstrosity. A somewhat analogous case was published in the British Medical Fournal of Feb. 22, 1873, in which the duration of pregnancy was 350 days.
