Prolonged Ureto-Gestation.-Dr. Park, in the Glasgou Mcedical Fournal, gives the history of a case of prolonged utero-gestation, in which the period of gestation was 33 I days. The foetus was anencephalic, and there was only a very small quantity of liquor amnii. The writer states that the most likely explanation of this prolonged gestation seems to be, that the cephalic extremity being flat on the crown and about the size of the palm of the hand, was incapable of being moulded and so filling up and pressing cqually upon the dilated neck of the womb. The small quantity of liq. am. is noticeable as bearing upon Rudolphi's theory as to the causation of the anencephalic monstrosity. A somewhat analogous case was published in the British Medital Fournal of Feb. 22,1873 , in which the duration of pregnancy was 350. days.
