TO THE PROBLEMS OF THE LAW OF THE SEA IN GENERAL AND FISHERIES

IN PARTICULAR. WE WILL CONTINUE TO WORK WITHIN THE U.N. CONFERENCE

ON LAW OF THE SEA TO REACH AGREEMENT NOT ONLY ON FISHERIES BUT ALSO

ON THE OTHER VITAL AND DIFFICULT ISSUES FACING THE CONFERENCE,

ISSUES SUCH AS THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN INTERNATIONAL AUTHORITY

FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE RESOURCES OF THE DEEP SEABED AND OCEAN

FLOOR WHICH CONSTITUTE THE "COMMON HERITAGE OF MANKIND"; THE

PRESERVATION AND PROTECTION OF THE MARINE ENVIRONMENT, INCLUDING

THE ARCTIC; AND THE BREADTH OF THE TERRITORIAL SEA AND THE

RELATED QUESTION OF PASSAGE THROUGH STRAITS USED FOR INTERNATIONAL

NAVIGATION. THESE ISSUES MUST FIND AN EARLY MULTILATERAL SOLUTION.

WE KNEW FROM THE OUTSET THAT THE SPRING SESSION OF THE

LAW OF THE SEA CONFERENCE IN NEW YORK COULD NOT ACHIEVE FINAL

AGREEMENT ON A NEW CONVENTION. AT LEAST ONE MORE SESSION WILL BE

NECESSARY FOR THIS PURPOSE, AND THE CONFERENCE WILL CONVENE AGAIN

IN NEW YORK FROM AUGUST 2 TO SEPTEMBER 17. WE HOPE IT WILL SUCCEED

BUT MUST ANTICIPATE THAT EVEN THEN THERE WOULD STILL BE FORMALITIES

TO BE CONCLUDED.
