PRAYERS.

Mr. Euler, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of the 17th February, 1936, for a Return showing:—

1. Amount of our exports of farm products during the years 1930, 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, and 1935, respectively.
2. Amount of imports of the same products during the same periods.

Mr. Pouliot, seconded by Sir Eugene Fiset, moved for leave to introduce a Bill intituled: "An Act to repeal 24-25 George V (1934), Chapter 25, An Act respecting the Bureau of Translations."

And the question being proposed;

Mr. Rinfret raised a point of Order on the ground that the proposed Bill involved the expenditure of public money.

After Debate thereon, the said motion was allowed to stand.

Mr. Church, seconded by Mr. Plunkett, by leave of the House, introduced a Bill, No. 5, An Act to amend the Criminal Code (Fines and Penalties), which was read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The following Orders of the House were issued to the proper officers under subsection 4 of Standing Order 44:—

By Mr. Boulanger:—Order of the House for a Return showing:—

1. Whether the Civil Service Commission was requested to hold a competition in connection with the replacement of Mr. G. C. Anderson as superintendent of mail contracts.

2. If so, when such competition will be held, to whom it is open and what the time limit is for the filing of application forms.
