PRAYERS.

Mr. Mackasey, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table, —White Paper entitled "Unemployment Insurance in the 70s". (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 4/82.

By unanimous consent, it was ordered,—That the White Paper on Unemployment Insurance tabled this day be referred to the Standing Committee on Labour, Manpower and Immigration.

Mr. Skoberg, seconded by Mr. Thomson (Battleford-Kindersley), by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-223, An Act to amend the Canada Labour (Safety) Code (Marine Workers), which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.
