RESOLUTION 11.

A Resolution for the relief of Millicent Eileen Goobie Davis.

[Adopted 17th March, 1964.]

Whereas Millicent Eileen Goobie Davis, residing at the city of Toronto, in the province of Ontario, wife of Harold Davis, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Windsor, in the province of Newfoundland, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the third day of April, A.D. 1948, at the town of Bishop's Falls, in the said province of Newfoundland, she then being Millicent Eileen Goobie; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, on the ground of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore the Senate of Canada, pursuant to the provisions of the Dissolution and Annulment of Marriages Act and subject to section 2 thereof, resolves as follows:—

1. On the expiration of thirty days from the date of the adoption by the Senate of this resolution, the said marriage shall be dissolved and thenceforth shall be null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.
