will be of help in this regard, but it is not a cure-all—it is no magic formula. Other steps need to be taken.

Wealth is the consequence of three things—first, the God-given base resource or material; second, the application of capital and, third, the application of labour—thus transforming God's gifts into something more valuable or desirable. Labour and capital have the right to their reward, but our natural resources are, in my view, the common heritage of all mankind; in a special way they are the common heritage of those who live in the nation where those resources are found. If we do not recognize this now through legislative steps, something more drastic will have to be done at a later date to rectify the situation.

In short, I believe we must take action to assure the future of Canada for all Canadians. I believe legislation is required to accomplish this.
