PETRO-CANADA ACT

MEASURE TO AMEND

Hon. Marc Lalonde (Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources) moved that Bill C-101, to amend the Petro-Canada Act, be read the second time and referred to the Standing Committee on Energy Legislation.

He said: Mr. Speaker, I am pleased to have this opportunity to introduce for second reading Bill C-101, to amend the Petro-Canada Act, which is an important legislative element of the Government of Canada's National Energy Program. As hon. members may know, these amendments were originally included in Bill C-94, the energy security bill. The Tories' strike-with-pay against Parliament was an avoidable and most regrettable incident. Time which could have been spent debating in Parliament our proposals for energy security was lost, for nothing as it turns out, since the government had said all along that it was ready to split Bill C-94 if there was an agreement to treat all its elements with some dispatch.

Again today, Mr. Speaker, we saw more abuse of Parliament as the Tories were trying to turn the House into a circus. All those members who presented a petition today were the same members who, in 1977, passed unanimously the statute law amendment to the Metric Conversion Act.
