Mr. Wilson (Laval)—On Thursday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. How many persons have been made prisoners of war since the declaration of war between the Allies, Germany and Austria?

2. Where have they been kept captive?
3. What is the name of each place of detention, and the name of the officer in charge of such place of detention?

Mr. Gauvreau—On Thursday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. How many persons were employed at the River du Loup car shops of the Intercolonial Railway, in the locomotive sheds and in the repairs establishment, respectively, from September, 1911, to 1st January, 1915?

2. How many of such persons were discharged, dismissed or suspended during the said period of time?
3. How many of such persons willingly accepted superannuation, and how many demurred when superannuated?

Mr. Gauvreau—On Thursday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. How many persons or companies have tendered to furnish the Intercolonial Railway with ice at Lévis and Campbellton?

2. What are their names and residences?
3. What is the amount of the tender in each case and the point of delivery of such ice?
4. Who obtained the contracts?
5. For what amounts were such contracts awarded?

Mr. Gauvreau—On Thursday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. Has the Department of Railways and Canals, the Minister, or the Government any information regarding the nationality of Mr. F. P. Gutelius, General Manager of Government Railways? If so, what is his nationality? If not, will such information be obtained?

2. Has the said F. P. Gutelius sent in his resignation, or has notice been sent him to this effect?

Mr. Gauvreau—On Thursday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—What are the reasons alleged by the Postmaster General for refusing to open a post office on the northeast shore of Lake Temiscouata, and to grant a subsidy to a new company which has been organized for the purpose of establishing communications between the two shores of said lake, thereby aiding to develop this important district of Lake Temiscouata and Des Squatecks, in support of which two requests are said to have been made to the Postmaster General by Dr. Dubé and F. X. Bélanger of Notre-Dame-du-lac, and Fraserville?

Mr. Sinclair—On Thursday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—How many refrigerator cars containing shipments of fresh fish only were transported from Mulgrave, N.S., to Montreal, attached to the regular daily express train running between said points, known as The Maritime Express, during the months of November and December, 1914, and January, 1915?
