each month 29 d. 12 h. 44′ 3½″, in the whole cycle 6939d. 16h. 83′ 8½″, the number of the days according to Rab Ada, stated above. Of these 19 years, there are 12 of twelve months,\* called Common, and 7 of thirteen months called Bissextile or Embolismic. The received embolismic or intercalated years, are the 3rd, 6th, 8th, 11th, 14th, 17th and 19th, in which it differed from the Metonic Cycle, every third year of which was Bissextile, and the 18th and 19th. The names of the months with their corresponding English months and Zodiacal signs are contained in the subjoined table:—
