

THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY

TO THE

Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society.

The following is a condensed statement of the work of this Society taken from the 11th Annual Report:—

Two new Branches were organized during the year, making in all thirty Senior, one sub-division, and seven Junior Branches.

Twelve Business and two Missionary Meetings were held, the latter, which were well attended, were addressed by the Misses Leslie and Rose, C. E. Z. M. S., who spoke on behalf of the women of India and China.

At the Annual Meeting, Mrs. M. B. Irvine, for several years Treasurer, was presented with a Prov.-Life Membership.

On January 3rd, the Bishop of Ottawa gave the members an address at their Quarterly Meeting.

The amount of money raised did not come up to that of the previous year; the pledges were as usual fulfilled, and money contributed to the Dioceses of Algoma, Qu'Appelle, Rupert's Land, Calgary, Saskatchewan and Mackenzie River, besides what was given to Foreign Missions.

Twenty-five bales have been sent away, the cost of new material and freight being \$466.11.
