NEW DRINKING FOUNTAINS.

The model of a pretty combination horse trough, drinking fountain, and dog trough is in Property Commissioner Harris' office. The design is artistic and if the fountain is adopted, it will undoubtedly add much to the appearance of the city streets. If the city decides to install such fountains, they will be built in concrete, and the cost of a little more than the present unsightly iron affairs, they will be permanent.

The fountain is built upon the square plan. There will be an oblong horse trough, with perpendicular sides, facing the street. At the two corners, on the sidewalk side, there will be octagonal pillars, on top of which will be the little spouting fountains for the quenching of human thirst. Close to the ground on that side and in the centre will be a little dog trough.
