The flames spread rapidly, as the water pipes had been broken and there was nothing with which to fight the flames. A strong wind was blowing, and this helped to spread the flames. The fire raged until early Tuesday morning, when the wind changed and the fire burned itself out. All the buildings along Duke. Port Royal King and East-streets were wiped out. The advices received here indicate that order was soon restored, so that the work of rescue could be begun. The two regiments of soldiers sta-tioned in the city were called on to do police duty. 


