MINES AND MINING STOCKS

Successful Development in Ymir Camp, B.C.

Big Plant to be Ordered for Ymir Mine—Deals for Properties in the Sloan and Nelson Divisions of the Western Province—Sudbury and Rainy River.

According to advice from Ymir Camp, B.C., its prospects are exceedingly bright. Its D. 1 prospects are being pushed forward as fast as possible for the erection of a large stamp mill at the Ymir mine. A few months ago the London & British Columbia Gold Fields, Limited, owners of this mine, decided to erect a 400 stamp mill, but since then such large bodies of ore have been discovered that the officers of the company rescinded their order for the 400 stamp, and are now contemplating putting 80 to 100 stamps up at the mine. They had already installed a five-drill compressor, have lately installed a 100-foot shaft on the 300-foot level to ascertain the probable extent of their bodies of ore. Average assays for the week ending July 9 on this shaft ran \$154 to the ton. The ore chute is from 50 to 50 feet wide and 42 in. diameter. The engineers that they is at the present time enough ore in sight to pay for the mine, and developing same, putting up the mill, and a profit of one-half a million dollars.

A Mountain of Gold.

Two of the men sent out last April on the joint expedition by the Rossland Gold Mining, Development and Investment Company, Limited, and the Yukon Mining Company, Limited, have returned. They report that they have acquired five very valuable claims within easy reach of the mill race in the Omeka district, British Columbia. The claims are the full regulation size, of 100 feet square, and the ore is low grade, but free mill and of great extent, much like the famous Treadwell mine in Alaska. The title to these properties has been secured, and the other men engaged in the expedition have remained to arrange a trail to the water, and to make further explorations. The prospect of a great discovery is being looked upon with interest.

ETHEL STOKES' TROUBLES.

To Matron Church of the First Police Precinct she told a pitiable story, which in effect was that three months ago she married a traveling man in Chatham, Ont., against the wishes of her parents. A few days ago he deserted her, and rather than go back home she set out to find him. She believed him to be in Buffalo and came here. All she had left was 50c. She walked the streets all day yesterday in the hope of meeting him and, being discouraged, bought a bottle of laudanum, which she intended to take the next day. Her parents have been notified of her whereabouts.

NEWS FROM MANILA.

General Otis Says Business is Improving Favorably.

Washington, Sept. 15.—General Otis today called the War Department as follows: Manila, Sept. 13: Affairs much more satisfactory. Demands for withdrawal of insurgent forces completely with, and all withdrawn or withdrawing today, except small forces in outlying districts, which are not obeying the insurgent leader. Aguinaldo requests a few days in which to withdraw them by detachment and punish their commanding officers. Over two thousand already withdrawn. No commission granted insurgents, but strict compliance with demands of 8th inst. required. General good feeling prevailing. Manila camp and business progressing favorably. No difficulty anticipated. Have been compelled to confine Spanish prisoners temporarily within limits of walled city.

San Juan, island of Porto Rico, Sept. 15.—The meeting of the Spanish and American Evacuation Commissions today lasted two hours. The American commissioners stood firm, and were met in a proper spirit by the Spaniards. The latter displayed no disposition to delay the work in hand.
