hoped that by the payment, in 1893, of final instalments on promised subscriptions, supplemented by a surplus from Pew Rents, that this account may be finally closed.

FOREIGN MISSION SCHEME.

The subscriptions toward this fund during the year amounted to \$1,114.47, while the expenditure has been \$1,200. It will thus be seen that had it not been for the balance at credit of the fund at the beginning of the year, there would have been a shortage. The Court believes it is only necessary to remind the Congregation of the importance of the work in which Mr. MacVicar is engaged, to secure all that is needed to sustain him in his good work.

MISSIONARY AND BENEVOLENT ALLOCATIONS.

The Court would suggest the following allotments of the balance at credit of the Weekly Offering account, viz :--
