## BROODED OVER MORTGAGE. Attacked Wife and Child, Then


Hanged Himself.


PIQUA, Ohio, March 10 .- When four of the little children of Mr. and Mrs. David Davis of Pattytown, Newton Township, went into their parents' bedroom this morning they saw their mother and one-year-old child lying, in bed with their heads crushed by an ax.

For several days Davis had brooded over inability to pay a mortgage. Early to-day he rose, and after strik-ing his sleeping wife and child on the head with an ax he had brought from the woodshed, he tried to kill himself with the same instrument. Falling in this he went to the barn and hang-ed himself from a beam. Mrs. Davis and the child are believed to be fat-ally wounded.
