THE HEROIC GRENELL

Governor and Hon. A. B. Morine
Pay Him Tribute

A large audience attended the lecture by Dr. Grenfell at the Gibson Hall last night. Lieutenant Governor Morine presided. In introducing the famous medical missionary from Labrador the chairman said it was seldom that heroes were spoken of who could be mentioned as being in the same class as Dr. Grenfell, not only because of the unselfish nature of the work he was engaged in, but also because of the great success which had attended his efforts.

Hon. Mr. Morine said he had been a resident of Labrador for 20 years, and had had much to do with many things which were a menace to the people. Dr. Grenfell had told him that it was easier to raise money for the purpose of ministering to the spiritual wants of the people than for the physical wants. Mr. Morine urged those present to act generously in regard to the \$100,000 institute, which Dr. Grenfell will build at St. John's, Nfld.

Dr. Grenfell said he had already donated and pledged amounts to \$65,000. Eighty thousand fishermen visited St. John's, Nfld., every year, and his proposed institute was intended to draw them away from the numerous saloons in that city.

At 8 o'clock Dr. Grenfell was the guest of honor at a special luncheon at the Press Club.

ICE PACK MOVES AGAIN

Moves 200 Yards at Entrance to the River.

NIAGARA-ON-THE-LAKE, April 16 (Special).—At an early hour this (Saturday) morning the mass of ice in the Niagara River reached a height of 40 feet above the water level, and it is still rising.

At 10:30 last night the immense ice flow which fills the river from bank to bank was given a shunt by the pressure from up stream and moved suddenly forward for about 200 yards, carrying with it and demolishing two docks at the river side depot.

The Wright private dock by the waterworks and the McIntyre Wharf, where the Turbina used to dock, were wrecked away.

The rush was sudden and the noise tremendous for a few minutes, but less than half an hour, aside from a slight churning and crunching far out amid stream, the glacier settled into sudden inactivity.

It stopped at the head of the Niagara Navigation Company wharf.
