London, Nov. 24.—Alleged plans for blowing up the Liverpool docks and the Manchester power and water plants, are said to show that they were made in mil-itary fashion, after detailed reports with drawings had been forwarded to "Irish republican army" officers by spies at each place that was destined for destruction. The plans, which are said to have been accepted when the documents relating to the spreading of typhoid and glanders were captured, were made public tonight after the statement of Sir. Hamar Green-

wood in the house of commons.

The Liverpool plans called for twenty-three officers, twentyseven engineers and seventy-five privates and 800 pounds of a high explosive, for attacking twenty-one points, most of them dock gates, with a view to stranding

Apparently every precaution was taken for dealing with the "enemy forces"—the police of both Liverpool and Manchester.
