FIVE FAVORITES FINISH IN FRONT ON FIFTH DAY AT WOODBINE PARK

Charley Summy, Third Choice, and Britain's Ally, Outsider, Win Opening and Closing Events on Thursday at the O.J.C. Meet.

Boniface, from the stable of Commander Ross, was a good horse yesterday, winning the Connaught Cup, the chief feature of the fifth day at Woodbine, by an open length from Romeo, Uncle John third, two lengths away, and the first of the field, via: Don Dodge, four lengths back. Commander Ross was cheered as he received the prize, given by Colonel William H. Head, president of the Ontario Jockey Club, on the steps of the judges' stand after the race. Mr. Ross also witnessed his new purchase, Baby Grand, land the Victoria Stakes, the second feature of the afternoon. Harry Giddings was also a double winner with Ostrera in the Maple Leaf Stakes and Britain's Ally, the last of that day that paid \$24.60 for \$2 in the closing event.

Sandy Wins Two.
Sandy was the winning rider, landing both of the Ross horses, the Connaught Cup and the Victoria Stakes, for Giddings. After Charley Summy, third choice, landed the opening event, a favorite finished in front in a row. Guy and Kanha were the beaten choice and they both finished outside the money. Yama stepped in a soft spot, coming out of the chute and making his first start with injury. The weather was again sunshiny and warmer and the attendance about 1000.

Murphy, second choice, was the first to show in the opening race, followed by Charley Summy, who went to the front rounding the turn to stay there and win by two lengths. Who Cares, always took the place, and Skeer Face the show. Guy, the favorite, was a disappointment.

Baby Grand Again.
Sandy had to just rate Baby Grand to win the \$3000 Victoria Stakes, the home of the nervous backers, though he drew it too close at the finish, less than a length ahead of Auntie May. John Corey was the third starter. The time, 1:02, was over two seconds slower than the track record.

Ostrera, from the Giddings stable, won the Maple Leaf Stakes impressively, coming from behind and running wild past the lot up the stretch. Woodbine a week in front of Royal Red Bird. Rose Richmond was an added starter. Guy took the early lead in the two-year-old sprint and won galloping. Ostrera second all round, and Flying Fox, beating Roseate a head for the show.

Boniface had not the hard field of the day before to surmount, and he also profited by a six hours' rest. Guy made his run the long route, rounding the lower turn and just moved them down coming home. Rose and Tom John raced in front most of the journey, and took down the second and show. The spectators furnished the finish. Field Captain passing Kingston Place on the flat after the first mile and was then beaten off. Lady Kee fell at the last hurdle the first round.

Outsider in Front.
Britain's Ally done the distance to nip Bengali at the wire for the tickets in the closing event of the day. Callan Mac stayed for the show and thus placed the Sagram colors once inside the money at this meeting.

J. F. Kelly has taken over the book of the Jockey Club, and will make his mounts for the remainder of the C. J. A. meetings.

Wash Norvell was an arrival from Baltimore. Jockey J. McIntyre also arrived from Maryland.

Judge Joseph A. Murphy is expected to arrive at Woodbine on Friday. He will stand at the Thornecliffe meeting. John Walters has decided to send a division of the George M. Hendrie stable from here to Hamilton, where they will be rested up until the opening of that meeting.

Baby Grand, the Granite-Babe colt, sported Commander J. K. L. Ross' colors for the first time when he went to the post in the Victoria Stakes. Mr. Luchheim, the former owner of the colt, came from Philadelphia for a few days' recreation.
