Dis From Exposure.
MONTREAL, Nov. 30.—After walking from Ahuntsic to Montreal, five miles, without any boots, Arthur Belletier fell on the street and was arrested for being drunk. It was later found that he was suffering from exposure and was admitted to the general hospital.

HURLS ONE SHOE AT MAGISTRATE

And the Other at Head of Clerk of Court When Suffragette Was Remanded For Further Inquiry.

ABERDEEN, Scotland, Nov. 30.—Militant suffragettes today brought about two scenes of extreme violence, in which a woman's shoes and a horse whip were used as weapons.
The first outbreak occurred when three of the women, Joyce Locke, Fanny Parker and Mary Pollock, who had been caught last evening in possession of explosives in the music hall where Chancellor Lloyd George was to speak, were brought up before the magistrate.
After hearing the evidence, the magistrate remanded them for further inquiry. As he informed them of this, Joyce Locke removed her shoes and hurled one of them at the magistrate's head, and then threw the other at the head of the clerk of the court. She was promptly committed for contempt of court.
The second outrage was committed by one of the members of a party of suffragettes who were waiting at the railroad station for the departure of the Chancellor Lloyd George. The woman mistook the man for the Chancellor and hurled a shoe at his head. She was arrested and charged with assault. She was remanded for further inquiry.

ALL LINES OF BUSINESS ON ENCOURAGING BASIS

Bradstreet's Reports Show Toronto Enjoying Active Trade—Outlook Good This Winter.

Toronto reports to Bradstreet's say that almost every line of business is on an encouraging basis at present. Collections have been fair in some departments and good in others. The hardware business orders have been coming in freely and prices have been not set up all and contrails must be filled. Leather is in good demand and recently advanced prices hold firm. Orders and big propositions have been turned down in some cases. Prices continue good in many lines. The lumber industry is on a very active footing. A good business is being done in house building materials and finished lumber for interior work. Orders are coming in and activity promises to continue. Business in groceries is encouraging. Especially are foreign fruits and nuts being called for. The latter are selling a cent to a cent and a half higher than a year ago. Canned goods are quiet. Eggs and beans are so scarce and high that they are being profitably imported. Cattle have advanced 25 cents on last week in a strong market, while hogs went up the same, and lambs advanced 20 cents per cwt. Some wheat has sold for ocean shipment, but Manitoba wheat, corn and oats have declined in value. Light money is keeping bond and stock markets quiet, while securities are holding firm. Real estate market has been strong in downtown districts. Prospective factories have difficulties in securing land. Sales of vacant land are frequent.

The duke cabled back:

"This reply, says the Star, should give the story its quietus."

Bears a Nuisance in Yellowstone Park.

Many bears have been captured within the last few weeks and shipped to parks in eastern cities, but the cost of capturing the animals is great, and as many of them are so bold as to be a nuisance in the park around camping outfits, it is believed best to kill them.


