Dr. Warwick Gives Definitions of Certified and "Grade A"

Dr. William Warwick, district medical health officer, of Saint John, who was attending to duties at the Department of Public Health yesterday, gave abbreviated definitions of grade "A" milk and certified cow milk, both of which may be sold under regulations of the department of health.

CERTIFIED MILK.

CERTIFIED MILK.

Certified milk is a particularly high grade of raw milk from cattle which are tubercolin tested every six months. This milk is produced under very stringent regulations regarding cleanlinease of both cattle and premises. All persons assisting in the handling of such milk are required to have a medical examination at least once a month by a veterinary surgeon. Particular attention is provided for the early detection and removal of any animal showing the slightest condition of illness. This milk must be promptly couled and bottled in sterile bottles within a 'very short time after milking.


