

THE HON. DONALD MORRISON DEAD

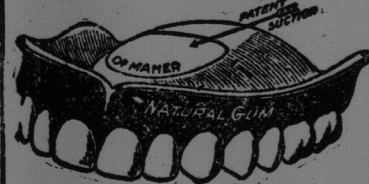
Miss Gwendolyn Belyea to Enter Acadia—Another, For Special Course in United Kingdom, to be Awarded This Fall.

Newcastle, Sept. 6.—Hon. Donald Morrison passed away at the Miramichi hospital at 4 o'clock on Saturday afternoon. Hon. Mr. Morrison was born at Burnt Church, Northumberland county, in November, 1852, coming to Newcastle while a young man. In his early days he opened a furniture and dry goods store and by painstaking attention to work and his genial personality established a successful business which he conducted for some years. Being a public-spirited man he soon entered the political arena and in 1903 was elected to the legislature. In 1908 he was again elected and appointed speaker of the house, which office he held until 1911. Always a Conservative he gave good service to his party.

In civic affairs he took a great interest and served on the first board of aldermen under the incorporation of the town of Newcastle in 1899, later holding the office of mayor for four successive terms and in that capacity giving great satisfaction. At the time of his death he held the position of fisheries inspector for the counties of Northumberland, Kent, Gloucester and Westmorland. He was a prominent member of the Loyal Orange order.

In the passing of Hon. Mr. Morrison the Presbyterian church loses one of its most valued members. In 1877 he was married to Miss Janie Fish who, with three sons and one daughter, survive. The sons are Sydney James, of Vancouver (B. C.); Roy Alexander and Donald Raymond, of Newcastle, and the daughter, Mrs. Clarence Wright of Fort Fairfield (Me.). There are also two brothers, Findley, of Wisconsin, and Peter, of Burnt Church.

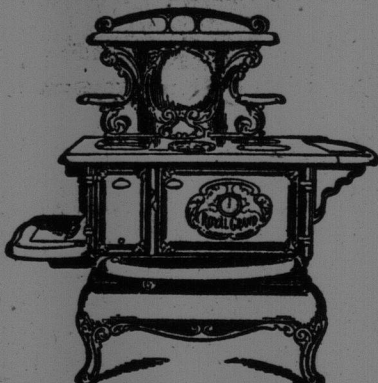

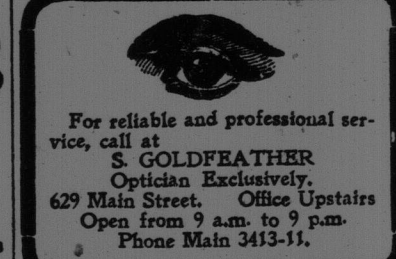

Edmonton, Alta., Sept. 7.—It looks now as if the Doukhobors, instead of quitting Alberta, as rumored a short time ago, are intending to settle down even more permanently than before. They have just organized, for business purposes, the "Christian Community of Universal Brotherhood of Alberta," which has been incorporated.

Peter Verigin himself, leader and business adviser of the Doukhobors, is No. 1 on the directorate, and associated with him are J. B. Shonkin and M. W. Cayroff. The concern opens up with an authorized capitalization of \$20,000 and Cowley is its headquarters.
