## WHAT'S DOING AT THE OPERA HOUSE

## GERMAN AIRMAN PLANS A FLIGHT ACROSS ATLANTIC

London, Oct. 4.—One of Germany's best known aviators will attempt a trans-Atlantic flight about the middle of October, according to a despatch to the London Times from Berlin. He will use an aluminum monoplane built by the Zeppelin Company. It will have

four motors. The aviator hoped to make the trip in 86 hours. He will take along a spare pilot and several mechanics.
