DON'T WANT THEM EVEN AS A GIFT

Attitude of Australians Respecting German Colonies—Against Annexation

Sydney, Australia, April 24—Public opinion in Australia, as expressed by some of the newspapers of Sydney and Melbourne, is represented as opposing the idea that Australia wants to annex the former German islands of the South Pacific. They point out that there has been a misapprehension in Paris and elsewhere as to the attitude of Australians on this point. For example, the Melbourne Age says: "An unhappy and untrue picture of Australia is being drawn by the peace conference. We are represented as demanding German territory as payment for our services in the war. A wrong impression is very well due to this representation of Australian opinion. Mr. Hughes (premier) appears to have given the unfortunate impression that Australia wants to annex the Pacific Islands. The only datum he can have is the resolution passed by both houses of parliament. November last, declaring that the captured German colonies must not be handed back to Germany, and that Australia should be consulted over their disposition. This is a very different thing from a claim for annexation. We want, in fact, to have as little responsibility for them as is consistent with our safety. It would be a calamity if they were given to Australia as a gift. Australia is not in a position to manage an empire in the Pacific. We have already far more territory than we can populate and develop."

The Sydney Daily Telegraph also disavows any desire by Australia to "retain a little empire" of her own. "What would have suited us best would have been the assumption of control in the Pacific by Britain herself," says the Telegraph. "Or even by America, if America had seen her way clear to stretch her ideas of anti-imperial policy. Most Australians, if they had been consulted, would have preferred not to take them (the former German possessions near Australia) at all if security could be obtained in any other way."

The Melbourne Argus declares that, since the whole Australian people were united in the determination that the islands should not go back to Germany, Australia should not shirk the duty of accepting a mandate for the islands. "It adds that the 'burden' will be heavy, the responsibilities great, the cost severe and the return, except in security, problematical."

GERMAN U-BOAT REACHES NEW YORK

New York, April 23—Unheralded and with no ceremony the first German submarine to reach the American seaboard since the armistice was signed passed Sandy Hook on last Saturday night with the Stars and Stripes flying above the German naval ensign. Without stopping except to signal the guardship Amphitrite at Quarantine the U-111, which gave her number as U-111, went to the Navy Yard and was comfortably berthed at 8:30 p. m.

The U-111 is a boat of 850 tons, 280 feet long and 25 feet beam, constructed on the same lines as the U-33 which visited Newport in October, 1918, and sank six ships the day after she left that port.

"We left Plymouth alone on April 3," the commander said, "and have had a fine trip except for a short spell of bad weather in mid-ocean. The U-111 has proved to be a very steady boat and has not given any trouble. We are bound for Portland, Maine, to assist in the Victory Loan campaign and put into New York for fuel and to await orders from the Navy Department to proceed."

The commander added that the crew consisted of four officers and thirty men. The trip occupied sixteen days from Plymouth to Sandy Hook, at an average speed of twelve to thirteen knots. She could travel eighteen knots on the surface, but that would cost up too much fuel.

When asked about the other German submarines that he left England for the United States, the officers of the U-111 said they knew nothing about their movements.

GERARD AIDS DAYLIGHT PLAN

New York, April 23—Plans for incorporating in the League of Nations draft a sanction of the daylight saving law were discussed at a luncheon of the Daylight Saving Association at the Aldine Club. Ex-Ambassador James W. Gerard accepted an invitation to act for the association in drawing up and presenting to President Wilson a resolution outlining its aims, with a recommendation that the covenant of the League of Nations provide for universal daylight saving.

Before the resolution is called to the president the matter will be taken up with Samuel Gompers, in order to receive the co-operation of the labor forces throughout the world.
