



The reply of the German big guns was very vigorous at some places, although as a whole it was weak. There are some indications that the Germans are withdrawing their artillery, although it is more probable that they are going to fight hard before being driven out after enduring a stifling barrage of more than eight hours.

The Germans at some points are increasing the volume of their big gun fire but ineffectually.

American forces this morning launched an attack on German positions, At nine o'clock they had progressed generally along the line. Some prisoners were taken at different parts of the sector.
