TARIFF CHANGES
May Be Cut on Farm Implementations
REDISTRIBUTION IN N. B.

Province Loses Two Seats—Guthrie Buys Coal For I. C. R. in United States—N. T. R. Report up Next Week

Ottawa, March 12.—With the budget speech coming some two weeks hence, rumors of tariff changes are beginning to be whispered in the government ranks. There is a well defined belief that there will be a reduction in the duty on agricultural implements to ten per cent, the present duty being seven and one half per cent.
This will be the government's attempted compromise with the farmers. It is expected that the government will also do something for their particular friends in the iron and steel industry. It is not believed that there will be any very drastic changes in the present iron and steel schedules, but some minor changes calculated to help the industry are known to be contemplated.
The whole question will probably be thrashed out at a party caucus to be held before the finance minister makes his budget speech.
It is practically certain that free wheat and free flour will not be granted this session at least.
In a return tabled at the commons this afternoon it was shown that the I. C. R. under the management of Mr. Grotzke, was buying coal in large quantities from the United States, one order showing 12,000 tons.
The redistribution committee will meet tomorrow to try to come to an agreement with regard to the new electoral map of Canada.
In the case of Prince Edward Island, it is likely that the report of the committee will favor four members for that province, instead of three, to which number the province is only entitled according to a strict interpretation of the population basis of representation.
In New Brunswick, the present outlook is for the combination of Madawaska and Restigouche into one riding, of Victoria and Carleton into one riding, of Queens-Kings into one riding, and of Sunbury-York into one riding. St. John city and county, and Albert may be united, and elect two members. The remaining constituencies will be Charlotte, Gloucester, Kent, Northumberland and Westmorland.

Daily Hints For the Cook
Lemon Pie
Juice and grated rind of 1 large lemon, 8 eggs, 1 cup sugar, 2 tablespoons water. Mix egg yolks, sugar, lemon and water. Cook in double boiler until thick. Cool and beat in the stiffly beaten whites of the eggs. Fill crust (previously cooked) then brown the pie in oven.
Cream Sponge Cake
Break 2 eggs into a bowl and beat until you can't beat any more. Add 1 cup of sugar and beat, beat, beat. (Use an egg beater both times) One teaspoon of baking powder, 1-2 teaspoon of salt and 1 cup of flour sifted into above mixture. Beat as well as you can, but mixture will be rather stiff. Add 1-2 (one-half) cup of hot milk and flavoring and beat again. Pour into pan and bake in rather a slow oven. The success depends on the beating.
