

A TAILORED MOIRE.

up with unanimous enthusiasm, and their lead has been followed on this side of the Atlantic, with the result that tailored costumes either developed or trimmed with moire are prominently presented in the new spring and summer fashions.

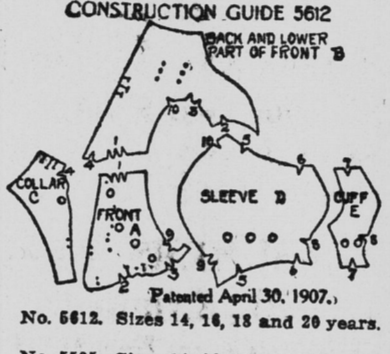
Four yards of 44-inch material will make this design, and, as moire ranges in price from \$1.50 to \$5.50 a yard, the cost of the dress may be limited to the income of the owner.

Today's lesson deals principally with the making of the little coat, because it may be made in any favored material and worn separately. To cut it, the pieces with the triple "TTT" perforations are laid on a lengthwise fold of the goods and the remaining pieces with line of large "O" perforations on a lengthwise thread of the material.

Now, for the making. Pleat lower edge of the front, placing "T" on small "o" perforations and tack. Center-front indicated by double "oo" perforations. Join front and back sections as notched. Slash back on lines of three small "oo" perforations; finish edges for openings to pass pleated ribbon through, in the front.

Adjust collar to position underneath front and stitch along single small "o" perforations, bringing single large "O" and double small "oo" perforations in collar and in front together; tack extension at upper edge of back to position, notches even. Close sleeve and cuff seams as notched, sew cuff to sleeve, notches and seams even. Sew in armholes as notched.

The skirt is high waisted and finished with a wide grille of soft satin, which is fastened at the front.



Misses' costume consisting of floured skirt and ceote, carried out in tan-go moire. The collar and cuffs are adjustable and may be of any favored material.

The Vogue for moire has never reached such a height as it has attained this season. Paris designers have taken it.

Daily Hints For the Cook

Rice or Tapioca Custard Pudding

Boil 1-3 cup of rice in plenty of water; when cooked, pour into a strainer. Put the strainer that holds the cooked rice under the cold water faucet, turning it over gently by shaking sieve. Butter your baking dish well, toss the cooked rice in dish, add 1 pint of milk, 1-2 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoonfuls of sugar, nutmeg to taste and 8 well-beaten eggs. Stir up. Put into oven, with indicator at 265 degrees or in a very slow oven, so it cannot boil, as it turns watery if it boils in oven. Stir in the beginning until it begins to curdle, then leave it alone until done, only turn it round so it will brown all over.

Use 1-8 cup pearl tapioca in place of rice, soaked over night in plenty of water. Drain off in the morning, then add custard and bake same as rice pudding.
