

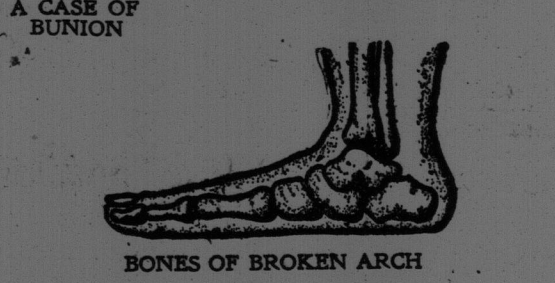

## ROYAL TEETOTALERS

Kaiser a Strong Advocate Of Temperance

**GEORGE V MOST ABSTEMIOUS**

Tea is Favorite Beverage of Queen Mary - Alfonso, Though Owner of Famous Cellar, Never Touches Wine or Spirits

(London Tit-Bits)

King Ferdinand of Bulgaria gave up beer, wine, and alcohol in any shape or form some years ago on the advice of his mother. The King is one of the least nervous among monarchs and keeps his temper in the most trying circumstances.

King Ferdinand is an exception among the Balkan rulers; King Peter of Serbia, the King of Greece, the King of Roumania, and the King of Montenegro all like their glass of wine.

It was in December, 1908, that the Kaiser became a confirmed teetotaler. His favorite drink is one invented by the Kaiserin a few years ago. It consists of orange juice and lemon juice placed in the interior of a pineapple, from which part of the fruit has been taken and the juice from it returned.

The pineapple is then placed on ice and filled up with mineral water; the drink being transferred to a glass with a ladle.

The German Emperor

This drink is, however, only taken as a special treat, the more usual beverage being a mixture of the juice of three oranges and two lemons, with a little sugar, mineral water being added.

The Kaiser has done everything he can to encourage temperance. He stated publicly a short time ago that "the next war will demand healthy men; war demands strong nerves, and victory will crown the colors of the nation which consumes the least alcohol."

Very little alcohol is drunk by the German royal family, though the Kaiser is the only absolute teetotaler. When he is invited to dinner he drinks a special temperance drink that he supplies to his host in advance, and is served to the emperor in champagne bottles. The reason for this is that the Kaiser's strict etiquette alcoholic drinks would be banished from all dinners at which His Majesty was present in the ordinary way. But the Kaiser values etiquette and drinks mock champagne while the guests are drinking the real variety.

King George

The crown prince, though not a strict teetotaler, has very strong views upon those who drink to excess. While a student at Bonn he gave offence to the university by protesting vigorously against the drinking of an exaggerated quantity of beer, by the students.

His sister, Princess Victoria, who was married with such pomp and ceremony, has an occasional glass of champagne, but when she is alone with her husband the beverages consumed on the royal table generally consist of non-alcoholic drinks of various kinds.

The late W. T. Stead wrote in the "Review of Reviews" when Queen Victoria came to the throne: "George V. is probably the most abstemious king who has ever ascended the British throne. I do not say that he is a Good Templar, or a Rechabite, or a pledged teetotaler. But I do say, with him, that although he sometimes takes a glass of wine, his usual beverages are distilled or mineral water and milk. There is not a man more abstemious in the use of intoxicants among all the millions who own his sway."

Queen Alexandra

"The proof of the pudding is in the eating, or rather, one should have proof of the drinking is in the shooting. King George is one of the finest shots in the kingdom, a point which could not hold if he were not practically a teetotaler. The king, by the way, rarely indeed takes a cup of afternoon tea."

Tea, on the contrary, is the favorite drink of Queen Mary. She drinks it, as a rule, without sugar.

Though Queen Alexandra is fond of good wine, she always provides a special Danish hot-weather beverage for her guests during the summer months. It is made of equal portions of the juices of oranges and crushed peaches, some slices of cucumber and a dash of ginger.

The whole is flavored with maraschino and when blended it is placed for a few hours on ice. Those who have tasted it say it is one of the most delightful summer drinks imaginable.

Queen Wilhelmina of Holland

Queen Emma of Holland is almost a fanatic on the question of strong drink, and she has instilled her temperance ideas into the mind of Queen Wilhelmina. Neither mother nor daughter touch alcohol in any shape or form. Until Queen Wilhelmina was married, in fact, wine was never seen on the royal table. Prince Henry, however, who likes a glass of wine, insisted that it should be provided for himself and his guests, though his wife and his mother-in-law are still strict teetotalers.

King Gustavus Adolphus of Sweden and his queen are both total abstainers, though the cellars of the palace are always stocked with fine wines. These are served to the guests of the royal family, though at private dinners water and lime juice are the only drinks served.

The Dowager Queen Sophia of Sweden is really the cause of this temperance of the Swedish royal family. For over forty years she has been the most powerful supporter of the total abstinence movement in Scandinavia, and has devoted a great deal of her time and wealth to furthering the cause.

King Alfonso

Her favorite son, Oscar, who is the chief heir to her fortune, has, for several years, been president of the Total Abstinence Society of Sweden.

Pleasure loving King Alfonso, he, nevertheless like his mother, Queen Christina, never touches wine or spirits. The young king is a total abstainer, not through policy or principle, but simply because he dislikes the taste of alcohol. The cellars of the palace at Madrid, however, are famous for the wine they

## INQUEST ENCORSED

First Held By Coroner on Wrong Side of Boundary Line—Must Be Repeated

Vancouver, Sept. 20 — Because Dr. Stewart of Mission, corner of British Columbia, did not know where the boundary line between this country and the United States lay, and because, apparently the neighbors did not know either, he held a British inquest with a British jury on American soil into the death of Motorman H. J. Plews, who died as the result of injuries received in the collision in the Chilliwack branch of the B. C. E. R. last Sunday morning. However, the crown authorities cannot recognize an inquest that was held on foreign soil, and the body having reached Canadian territory, it is necessary to start all over again.

## BIG TIM'S ESTATE OF TWO MILLION DOLLARS GOES TO RELATIVES

Timothy D. Sullivan's will has been filed for probate in the New York Surrogate's court. It was read in the New York office of William B. Ellison, counsel for the committee of Cong. Sullivan's estate, to the legates and later made public.

This will, which was executed Oct. 8, 1907, leaves the entire estate, real, personal and mixed, of every kind, name, nature and description, to his sisters, Mrs. Margaret Ann Hickey and Mrs. Mary Ann Sommers, and his brother, Patrick H. Sullivan and Lawrence Mulligan.

The will provided that, if either of the sisters or the brothers were dead, the share should go to their children. Mrs. Sommers is dead, and under this clause her share of the will goes to her three children.

Cong. Sullivan made the following reference to his wife, Mrs. Helen Fitzgerald Sullivan, who died a year ago: "In making no provision in this my will for my beloved wife, Helen Sullivan, I am mindful of the fact that such dower right as my said wife may be entitled to in the real estate which I may leave will be amply sufficient to provide for her for the remainder of her life."

Er-Corporation Counsel Ellison estimates Cong. Sullivan's estate at \$2,000,000, of which \$1,000,000 is the value of his real estate, chief of which is his part-ownership of the Dewey and Gotham theatres. Accordingly had Mrs. Sullivan survived her husband, she would have had a life interest in more than \$1,000,000 worth of property. As the result of her death the entire estate may be distributed as soon as the estate is settled.

Lawrence Mulligan, Patrick H. Sullivan and Mrs. Hickey will each get about \$200,000, and the four children of Mrs. Sommers will divide this sum. Cong. Sullivan and his wife had no children, but Miss Aida Sullivan, a young woman now on the vaudeville stage, has claimed to be the daughter of Big Tim and she may file a contest of the will, although she was never legally adopted.

The will named Patrick H. Sullivan and Lawrence Mulligan as executors, and it was witnessed by the late Timothy D. Sullivan, known as "Little Tim," and the latter's law partner, Henry J. Goldsmith.
