TREATY WITH WEST INDIES LIMITED ONE
Not So Far-Reach as Was Imputed, is Report Now
COMMISSION'S REPORT
Said Government Has Taken Shorter List of Two Proposed by That Body and Many Important Products of Dominion Are Not Included
(Ottawa, Ont., April 17.—It would not be surprising if the details of the recent agreement arrived at between Canada and the West Indies, which made public, should show that the arrangements for reciprocity trade are not so far reaching and important as stated by the ministerial press. It has been authoritatively announced that the agreement is based on the report of the imperial West Indies commission which investigated trade between Canada and the West Indies and submitted a report to the imperial government two years ago.
