Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.
ANY Person who is the sole head of a family or any made over to 16 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency of the Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader must live with a minimum of 80 acres suitably owned and occupied by him or by his wife, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may acquire a quarter section of six years from date of homestead entry (including) the time required to earn homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including) the time required to earn homestead patent and cultivate fifty acres extra.
