DR. PUGSLEY TELLS OF GREAT HARBOR WORK

Great Development on West Side Ready for Tenders as Soon as Transfer is Completed-New Post Office a Handsome Build-

"The specifications for the work to be first done on the west side," said Hon. Mr. Pugsley, "have been prepared and the department is ready to call for tenders, but before doing so I think it proper that the transfer agreed upon should be completed. I do not know of anything standing in the way of this, and I am expecting every day to learn that the necessary documents have been signed.

"The first work will consist of the building of a wharf from the harbor line to the southward of Sand Point inshore to and upon the 400-foot strip, so called, a distance of about 800 feet, then extending southward on the 400-foot strip a distance of about 800 feet.
