## Isaac Adams Lost Life in

Tobique Twenty-three Days Ago.

PLASTER ROCK, N. B., May 31.—After being in the water for 23 days, during which time practically a continuous search was kept up, the body of Isaac Adams, of Lerville, Victoria county, was recovered on Saturday morning at 9 o'clock. Adams was drowned at the headwaters of Tobique May 7 while on one of the Fraser Company's drives. His body was discovered by Allan Traflet and George Everett, two of the Fraser Company's employees, and was lodged in a deep hole one and a half miles below the point where the accident occurred. It was in 11 feet of water and was nearly covered by mud and sand brought down by the spring freshet. The body was taken immediately to Riley Bay, where the coroner A. W. Ridgeway viewed it and decided it was unnecessary to hold an inquest. The remains were taken to Mr. Adams' late home at Lerville, where the funeral was held today.

## SAYS REPORT RE CHURCH UNTRUE

Rev. J. V. Young Speaks on Church of England Matter

Expresses Belief That 99 Per Cent. of Anglo-Catholics Will Not Unite With Rome.

## History of Church.

Father Young traced briefly the history of the Church of Christ, declaring that the Anglican church did not "originate from the Roman Catholic church" but was founded at Pentecost as the Church of Christ and was already established in England before the fourth century. At the Reformation there had been a "weeding out of wrong doctrines and abuses" but the continuity of the church had not been broken. Then in 1838 had come the great Catholic Revival or the Oxford movement, which he sincerely believed was the greatest of all religious movements of history. It had brought religion back to the church, emphasizing the sacraments as the means of grace and re-stating the belief in the real presence. Low church Anglicans with the honest love of God and their fellowmen in their hearts did not believe in confession which Anglo-Catholics held to be plainly taught in the prayer book. The Low Churchmen, Father Young thought, were influenced by fear of the Roman Catholic church in that disbelief.

## Persecution.

Father Young said perhaps the very great success of the Anglo-Catholic church in England in the last few years had been a bad thing and perhaps at the present time was going through persecution that it might be strengthened. There was one thing certain, "we are not going to Rome," said Father Young. He referred to the conference of the English Bishops with Cardinal Mercier, describing it as merely a talking over of differences as he himself might discuss the difference of the Anglo-Catholics to his mind would never unite with Rome. They had the privilege of all the sacraments and would not willingly give themselves up to the supremacy of Rome. That one third of the Anglicans in England wanted an alliance with the so-called free churches he did not believe either. ## 5,000 Lives Lost in China Quake and Fire

Associated Press Despatch.

PEKING, China, May 31.—Five thousand lives were lost in the earthquake and fire that destroyed the town of Talifu in northwest Yunnan, according to Father Salvat, of the Roman Catholic Mission there, whose story of the holocaust has just reached Peking.

## 2-Minute Trip

LYDENBERG.

Tall-fu, latest Chinese city to suffer from earthquake, occupies a site of unexampled natural loveliness on a beautiful lake, but is prevented from attaining modern prosperity by medieval transportation conditions, according to the National Geographical Society.

Its communication, not only with the nearest railroad 200 miles away, but with nearby towns in the same province, is hampered by excessively bad roads over which commerce can only proceed by horse and mule caravan.

Tall-fu lies in the province of Yunnan, in the extreme southwest corner of China, near the Burmese border. Revolutions, local uprisings, and bandit raids have combined to make the province one of the most turbulent sections of China in recent years. The territory about the city is unusually fertile and of better transportation and civil conditions are secured it is believed Tall-fu would become one of the most prosperous provincial cities of China.

The movement in Canada would be slow because of the distance and size of the country but he urged his congregation to pray earnestly and always to be loyal to the teachings of the Church, which would still be the English Catholic Church.
