San Francisco, May 3.-Theodore Durrant will be placed on trial for his life for the murder of Minnie Williams. He was held to answer on the charge in the superior court, bail being refused. Police Judge Conlan, the committing magistrate, in rendering his decision, briefly reviewed the case and the evidence adduced against Durrant. In conclusion, the judge said: "The people, I consider, have surely wound a chain of circumstances in this case around one object-Durrant-and to cap the climax the property of the dead girl was found in his possession. The chain is complete, and in my opinion nothing is wanting."

Subsequently Durrant's preliminary examination for the murder of Blanche Lamont was taken up. The evidence related to Durrant's accompanying the girl from school on the day she was murdered, and to his social intimacy with her. Blanche's aunt. Mrs. C. G. Noble, was asked by the defence to identify the dead girl's handwriting. She was cross-ex-amined for an hour on this point. The only writing which has concerned the case hitherto was that on the paper enclosing Blanche's rings and bearing the names of George R. King and Prof. Shernstern. The defence apparently wished to show that Blanche herself wrote those names, to establish their new theory that Blanche had not been killed, and that the body in the steeple was that of someone else.
