Berlin, July 4.—German foreign

Berlin, July 4.—German foreign policy is likely to experience a vigorous change through the retirement of Baron von Schon as Foreign Secretary and the appointment in his stead of Herr von Kiderlen-Wachter.

The new minister ranks as one of the most shrewd and forceful men in German politics. He was acting Foreign Secretary during the Balkan crists in the spring of 1909, and is understood to have been personally responsible for the policy which resulted in Russia's recognition of the annexation of Bosnia and Herzegovina by Austria under direct coercion from Germany. Von Kiderlen-Wachter, who is popularly known as "the Dumpling," owing to his fondness for that famous South German specialty, has been stationed at Bucharest as the German Minister for the last ten spears, but had many special assignments in the meantime, including frequent representations of Baron von Marschall von Bleberstein as Ambassador at Constantinople.
