## MARINE NOTES OF THE WORLD

## JETTISONED PART DECKLOAD.

Liverpool, July 24.—Stmr Myrtle Holme (Br), from Dalhousie, when off Banks of Newfoundland, July 13, took list and was obliged to jettison part deckload.

## SCHOONER LEAKING.

New Haven, Conn., Aug. 6.—Schooner Peabody, from Boston, N. J., for Salem, Mass., with sand, returned to this harbor today in tow leaking badly, and was beached on the mud flats. She sprang a leak last Friday on a blow on Long Island Sound and was towed in here the following day. Yesterday she proceeded eastward, but began to take in water and had to get a tug to bring her back.

## DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.

Boston, August 7.—Captain Anderson of stmr Menominee (Br), from Antwerp, reports July 28, lat 48 07, lon 25 25, passed mast of a large schooner covered with marine growth.

## RECORD PASSAGE.

The Royal George arrived at Avonmouth, G. B., Saturday, after making a record journey, her time being 8 days, 17 hours, 4 minutes, while from land to land she occupied only 3 days, 19 1/2 hours. Her passengers reached London before lunch time, while those bound for Paris arrived there before midnight the same day.

## STEAMER OCAHO.

The steamer Ocaho, Capt. Coffin, sailed from Halifax on Tuesday, bound south. Among her stowage passengers are 38 Orientals for Trinidad and ten for Demerara.

## BIG TOW BOAT LAUNCHED.

The towboat Charles P. Greenough, built at Rockland, Me., for Boston parties at a cost of \$95,000, and said to be the second largest wooden towboat on the Atlantic coast, was launched on Tuesday. The craft measures 114 feet long, 28 1/2 feet beam and 16 feet deep. Its gross tonnage is 400.

## MARINE DISASTERS.

London, August 6.—A quantity of the cargo of steamer Titan (Br), Evans, from Tacoma, Seattle, etc., via Singapore for Liverpool (previously reported ashore at Jeddah and redacted), has been transhipped.

Str. Yearby (Br), from Cape Town, before being wrecked at ground at Preston, has been floated.

## BIGGEST LINER ARRIVES.

New York, August 7.—With more than 4000 passengers, the liner crossed the Atlantic before it ever crossed the Atlantic before in any vessel, 2116, the Imperator, the biggest of ocean liners, arrived late today. Counting her crew, the Imperator had more than 4500 persons on board. Of these, 303 were in the first cabin, 519 in the second and 794 in the third. In the steerage were 1522 more. The Imperator crossed from Cherbourg in 5 days, 19 hours, 8 min.

## THE FURNACE LINE.

The steamer Kanawha, Captain Kellman, arrived yesterday from London via Halifax, with a large general cargo and docked at the Pettibone wharf. She shifted to the I. C. R. wharf early this morning.

## STEAMER GUERNSEY ARRIVES.

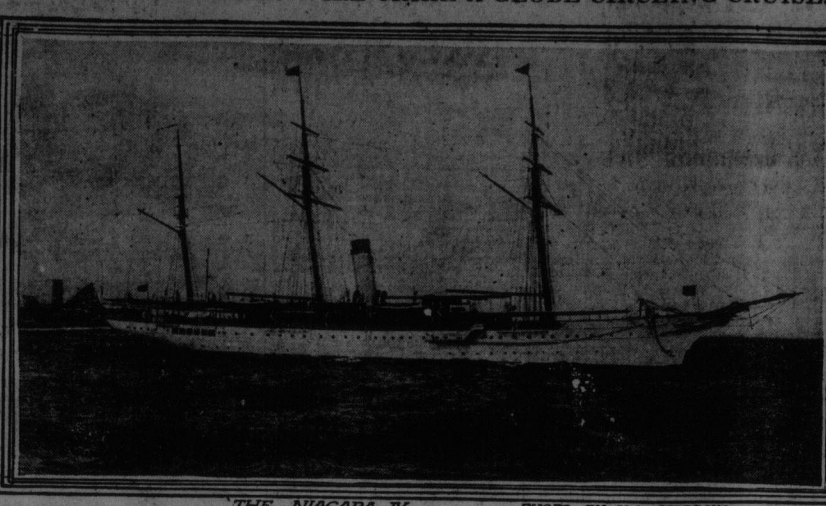

It is required on the other hand to give vouchers to the government for every cent spent and to its credit it is said none of its accounts have ever been challenged. The object of this communication is to warn the public against fictitious organizations soliciting support to any work for the blind.
