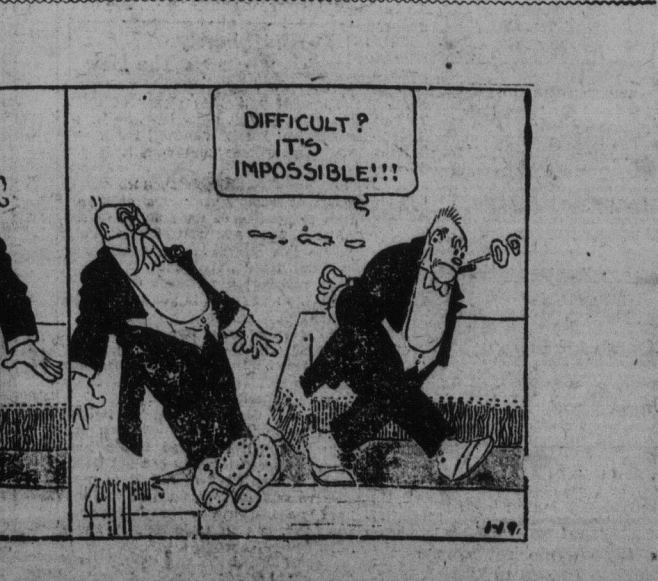

**Synopsis of Canadian North-
west Land Regulations.**

The pole head of a family, or any male over 18
years old, who was at the commencement of the
present year, and has since continued to be a British
subject or a subject of an allied or neutral country,
may homestead a quarter-section of available
Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or
Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the
Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the
district. Entry by proxy may be made in certain
cases. Entry of land in each of three years.
In certain districts a homesteader may secure
an adjoining quarter-section as pre-emption.
Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties--Rent six months
in each of three years after earning homestead
patent and cultivate 50 acres extra. May obtain
pre-emption patent as soon as homestead patent on
certain conditions.

A settler after obtaining homestead patent if he
cannot secure a pre-emption, may take a purchase
homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per
acre. Must reside six months in each of three
years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth
\$500.00.
Holders of entries may grant time of employment
as farm laborers in Canada during 1917, as resi-
dence duties under certain conditions.

When Dominion Lands are advertised for pre-
emption, returned soldiers who have served over
one year and have been honorably discharged, receive
one day priority in applying for entry at local
Agency office (but not Sub-Agency). Discharge
papers must be presented to Agency.
