A MAMMOTH PORPOISE

CAPTURED OVER BAY

Big Bay of Fundy Denizen
Weighing Several Hundred
Pounds Stranded at Bridge-
town.

A large porpoise weighing several
hundred pounds, was caught at the
foot of the electric light dam in Bridge-
town. This fish seldom ever goes in-
side of Digby Gut, but is frequently
shot outside by the Indians. This one
had come up the basin and river for
nearly sixty miles, and from Paradise
to Lawrence town, more than two
miles through fresh water, a most ex-
ceptional manoeuvre for a porpoise.
As he was nearly lively in the shallow
water it took the efforts of several men
with ropes and gear to capture it. And
the men got a fine ducking before they
landed the Bay of Fundy spouter. The
fish would carry nearly a barrel of oil.
