## MATRICULATION.

## Matriculation.

The regular examinations for admission to the Freshman Class will take place on Tuesday, October 3, beginning at 9 A. M.

Candidates for Matriculation will be required to pass a satisfactory examination in the following subjects:

I.—Latin. Cæsar, Gallic War, Book I., or Books II. and III.; Vergil's Æneid, Book I.; Cicero, two Orations against Catiline, or the Manilian Law; Latin Grammar (Harkne-s' is preferred); Smith's Principia Latina, Part IV: Exs. 1–25, or the equivalent.

II.—(a)—Greek. Dr. Smith's Initia Græca, Part 1.; Xenophon, Anabasis, Book I., or Book IV.; Greek Grammar, (Hadley's or Goodwin's is preferred.)

(b)—French. Grammar as in Otto's French Grammar. (A thorough knowledge of the conjugations is especially insisted on.) Translation, LaBelle Nivernaise, (Daudet), or an equivalent.

III.—Mathematics. Arithmetic; Algebra to the end of Quadratic Equations; Geometry, as in Hamblin Smith, Books I.–IV. (inclusive), or the equivalent thereof.

IV.—English. Grammar; Writing from Dictation; a short Composition upon a subject drawn from one of the following works: Shakespeare's Julius Cæsar or Merchant of Venice; Longfellow's Evangeline; Macau the La expres punctu
