The year 1857 constitutes the 6570th of the Julian period; 5617th according to the Jews; the 5861st, according to Usher; and the 7365th according to the Septuagint, since the creation of the world; the 2610th of Rome according to Varro; and the beginning of the 1274th of the Hegira, the years of which are purely lunar.

MORNING AND EVENING STARS.—*Venus* will be evening Star until May 8th; then Morning Star the rest of the year. *Mars* will be evening star until June 5th; then morning Star the rest of the year. *Jupiter* will be evening star until April 12th, then morning star until October 30th, then evening Star the rest of the year. *Saturn* will be evening star until July 11th; then Morning Star the rest of the year.

ECLIPSES 1857.

There will be two Eclipses of the Sun, this year—1st March 25th, and 2nd, Sept. 17th. both invisible in St. John.
