SARNIA NOW FREE FROM SMALLPOX
SARNIA, March 18.—At a brief special meeting of the board of health this afternoon reports showed that the city is now free of smallpox, all cases previously recorded having been released. Inspector Crosby advocated the continuance of the lease of another month on the house secured to isolate a recent patient and to care for any further cases that may develop. The board concurred and authorized the continuance of the lease. A reply was received from the Sarnia Hospital Board in reply to a communication sent following the last meeting to ascertain if it would be possible to secure the house which comprises part of the hospital property for use as a temporary isolation house. The hospital board pointed out that the city council would be the proper body to approach, and Secretary J. D. Stewart was requested to bring this matter to the attention of the council at the next session.
