5thly. The said "*Route de l'Eglise.*"

6thly. The road commonly called "*l'Or- 5*
mière," from its intersection with the last
mentioned road, to its intersection with the
road leading from Champigny hill to the
Bridge commonly called the "*Red Bridge,*"
or "*Commissioners' Bridge.*" 10

7thly. The road commonly called St.
Foy Road from a point one hundred yards
beyond the place where it is intersected by
the road commonly called "*la Suède,*" to
the top of the hill at Cap Rouge. 15

8thly. The road leading from the St.
Foy road near the Church of the Parish of
St. Foy to the road called St. Lewis Road
or "*La Grande Allée.*"

9thly. The Cove or Beach Road between 20
the Cliff and the River St. Lawrence for
one mile and a half beyond the South-west
extremity of Sillery Cove.

10thly. The Road leading from the 25
Church of the Parish of Charlesbourg to
the village of St. Pierre, for one mile and
a half only.

11thly. The Road fifthly mentioned 30
and described in the ninth section of the
said Ordinance from the south-western side
of the land known as Hough's farm, for
one mile in the direction of the Church of
the Parish of Saint Augustin; 35

and the said
roads and parts of roads, or such of the
said roads and parts of roads as the balance
which may remain of the loan raised by the
said Trustees under this Act, after paying 40
the value of the said bridge and premises,
may enable the said Trustees to make,
improve and repair, shall be made, improved
and repaired by the said Trustees in the
order in which they are mentioned in this 45
Act.
