Homeowners Association has endorsed the concept plan presented to it by the planning department at a public

ieeting last September. In a letter to council, homeowners' president Ken Dear said' the plan, which reduces the density of the community to just over 30,000 people, had been endorsed by he homeowners. The meeting was held as a

result of concerns by residents that the variety of housing, and especially the apartment buildings envisioned in the original development plan, were not being provided.

Barrick property on the Cooksville Creek, just south of the Queen Elizabeth Way.
