of Saturday, or at any other time more convenient to His Excellency, I should feel it a great privilege.

I am sorry to trouble you to the extent of writing, and should hesitate in so doing did I note feel that in all probability His Excellency would wish to make Mr. Rockefeller. Junior's acquaintance while he is here, and be glad to know of his coming to Canada.

As you doubtless know, the Rockefeller Foundation, of which Mr. Rockefeller, Jr. was the President at the time. was the first organization in america to come to the relief of the Belgians and to extend assistance to the Professors of Louvain University in arranging for their transfer to Oxford. Since the commencement of the war, the Foundation has contributed over seven millions of dollars, in the nature of relief in one form or another, to the needy and suffering in the countries of the Allies.
